

Please kindly note that the school office cannot take bookings for Energy Kidz, and this must always be done thorough the company directly.





Contact tracing over the Easter holidays

Schools continue to play an important role in contact tracing and the national effort to limit the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). Therefore, we will have an arrangement over the Easter holidays similar to what we had over the Christmas holidays:

- Please call contact Rebecca Abrahams on her mobile phone (07932 995213) if your child tests positive for coronavirus (Covid-19) and they developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school. The school will assist in identifying close contacts and will advise self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.
- If your child tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) during the holidays, having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, you are not required call the school. Parents/Carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.
- After the first 6 days of the Easter holidays, all positive cases should be dealt with through NHS Test and Trace. This means that the school will remain on call until Thursday 1st April.
- If your child needs to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case during the holidays, you do not need to inform the school about this until the first day of the Summer term.

Birthday cakes and treats

This is just reminder that, at the moment, children are not able to bring cakes or similar treats into school to share with their classes on their birthday. This is because, in line with our risk assessment, we are seeking to minimise the sharing of any food products at the moment to reduce the risk of contamination and transmission. We would ask, if you did still want to share any treats with classmates, that this is please done at the end of the school day outside of the school gates, accompanied by parents.

Extra Curricular Clubs

I am pleased to say that we feel that we are now in the position to safely resume some extra curricular clubs after school in the Summer Term. These will be carried out strictly in year group Bubbles, with all our safety measures in place. Anna will be in contact with parents who have signed up for these clubs in due course.

Tower Hamlets Together— a message from the Local Authority



Wishing you all a safe and enjoyable Easter holiday.








Miss Bingham has been very impressed by the partnership shown in her maths group this week.
