#### Attendance update

### **An update from the Children's Commissioner on the family review**

Furthermore, we have been asked to share this update from the Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza:

"Family is a core pillar of my work as Children's Commissioner, following ['The Big Ask' survey](#), which demonstrated how important families are to children.

Children explained how having a supportive family has a positive impact on their lives, from receiving emotional support, to being able to talk with family members about their worries and aspirations for the future. I have been commissioned by government to undertake a review of family life across the country.

The family review will seek to understand the composition of the modern family. It will explore whether the needs of children are understood in the provision of services to families, and how we can improve children's outcomes by developing the way public services understand the needs of families as a unit.

Capturing the voices of children and their families is key to this review. That is why I am launching my call for action. Please encourage children and their families to complete the questions on the [Children's Commissioner website](#), and to share their view on family life. The answers will help us understand what children think of family life and help inform our work".

Hopefully you will be able to find some time together to do this at home over the weekend. We need to make sure that these reviews that generate changes to provision, are informed by our voices....

### **Young Minds**

And then I also wanted to share this organization with you. ### **Safety**

Two quick notes regarding pupil safety.

First to highlight that the weather next week promises to really improve. It was noticeable today that the children were already coming off the playground, very warm and in some cases with the sun impacting their skin.

With the weather getting warmer, please consider what your child needs to keep themselves safe. A bottle of water in school is always useful. If their skin is sensitive to the sun, please make sure they apply sun cream before attending school and then have some in their school bag to reapply later in the day if they need to. And also consider whether a cap might be helpful, to cover their heads when they are outside playing.

The children need a break and they need the chance to have fresh air and run around, however we want them to be able to do this safely. Thank you again for your support.

Secondly, please can I also remind you that to protect our children we are a **Nut free** school. Please make sure any pack lunches or snacks that the children bring in are free from nuts.

And I close this week acknowledging that next week, the Year 6 children will sit their SATs exams. They are the first cohort for three years to do it. I know that you will be praying for them as indeed, so will we. I hope they rest well, stay well hydrated and nourished, as well as safe, so that when they come in each day next week, they feel ready to work hard and feel the impact of their studies all year.
