Sports Day

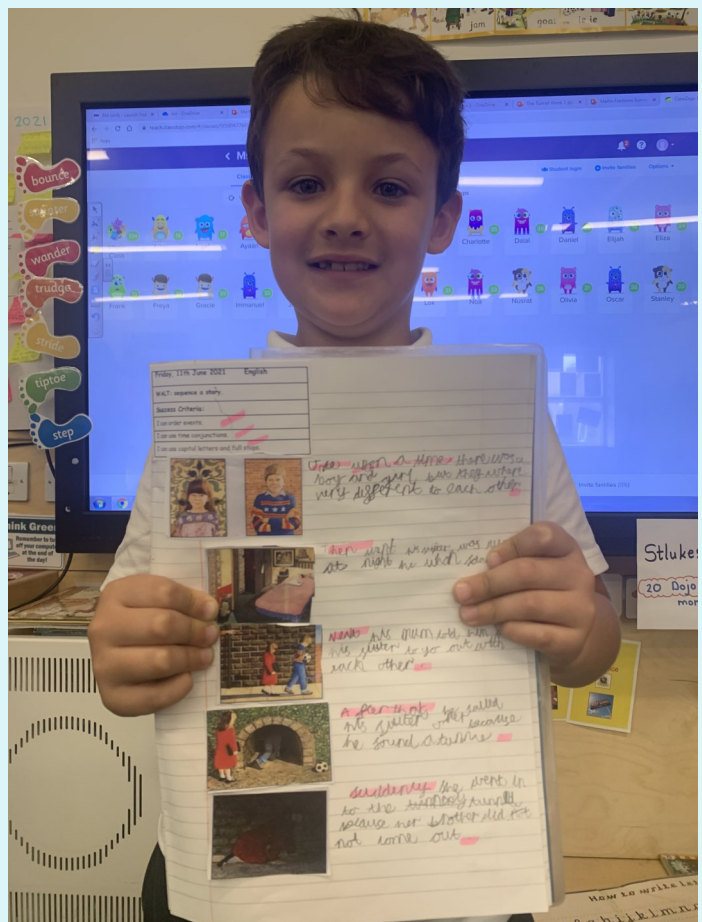
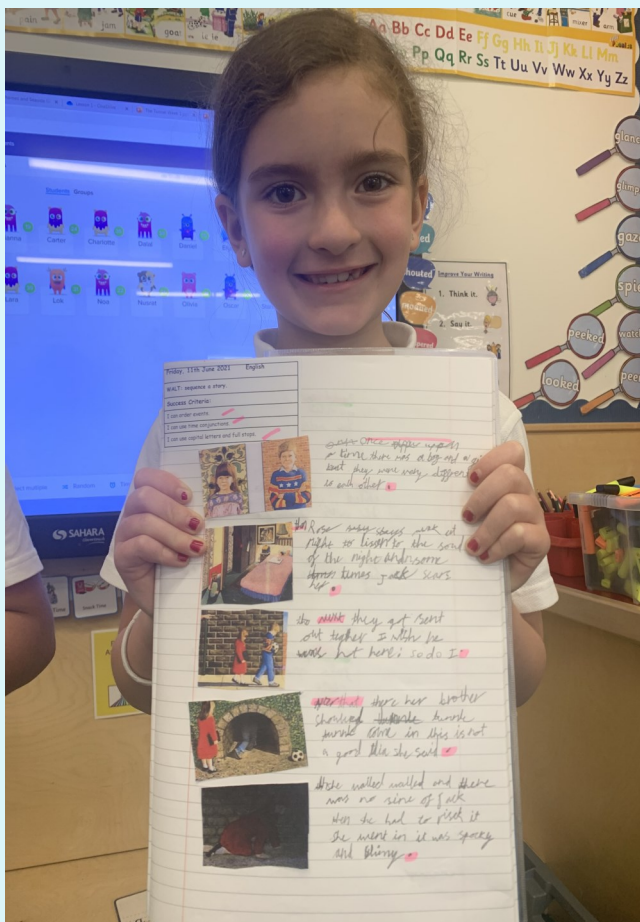
