#### Update on the PTA

I met with Beccy Brown today to discuss the PTA. For those of you who do not know Beccy, she until very recently, has been the Chair of St. Luke's PTA, and along with the support of many of you, she has steered the PTA to being a highly effective organization that has supported the school considerably over the years.

It has been quite common for the PTA under Beccy's leadership to raise in excess of £10,000 a year, and this school is indebted to the PTA and Beccy for this, as their donations have enabled us to make changes to our site and provision that we otherwise would not have been able to afford. An example of this, is the climbing frame in the main playground.

The PTA currently has £10,000 more for the school to spend. It was initially raised to fund PE climbing equipment for the hall and for staging. Those items remain on our wish list, but first and foremost we have asked the PTA to allow us to spend that money on improving the area around the climbing frame so that it is a nicer area for the children to enjoy that inspires their play and friendship. Currently, the area has experienced a high level of wear and tear and looks shabby as a consequence. I hope you agree making this area safer and more fit for purpose is a sensible thing to do, that all children will benefit from.

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## Update on the Swimming Pool

As many of you are aware, we have been having issues with the pool for some time now and recently have had to cancel all swimming for an indefinite period of time. Sadly this is something that is beyond our control, as the school doesn't have the necessary funds in our reserves to initiate the repairs required ourselves. This is because the pool is in need of an extensive refurbishment. Many of the component parts involved in the filtration, sanitation and heating systems are regularly failing and hence a decision was made by the London Diocese Board for Schools (LDBS), who are in effect the landlord, to finance a full refurbishment of the pool. The sums involved here being £30-40,000. However, the LDBS have applied for a grant that they believe they have some reasonable chance of being successful in, hence the delay.

We have of course made the LDBS aware that the most recent failure has led to a full shutdown of the pool, with all swimming cancelled until further notice, and have asked them to urgently expediate commencement of the works. We will continue to regularly remind them of the pressing need to do so. From the conversations we've had, although we have been given no guarantees, our understanding is that the required works will be started in the weeks ahead and that the pool will be back up and working for sure for the new school year. We though would prefer to see the pool being used again this term, and continue to push for that.

You may be interested to know that a comparable school to ours in terms of size as a two form entry Primary School, with an inner city location and with similar demographics however without a pool, would receive the same level of funding as we do. This would mean that they have the same funding as us but would be free from needing to fund the running costs of a pool, it's associated premises, and the swimming teacher.

It is for that reason that we need to work with our external partners in order to fund such extensive works.

On a positive note however, once the works are complete, the pool and accommodation will be transformed therefore enabling us to have more regular uninterrupted swimming from that point on.

## A closing note on attendance

Wow!!!

This week was brilliant.

A great opportunity to highlight to the children the importance of decimals, as Willow Class had 99%, Spruce Class had 99.1% and Oak Class won with 99.6%!!

On Thursday this week, the whole school attendance was 98.1% which is so strong.

A big thank you from me to all of you, for supporting us so well, by getting the children in to school.



## Key dates coming up this half term:
