A new strategy was launched on Wednesday 19th May to reduce violence, vulnerability, and exploitation (VVE) affecting children and young people in Tower Hamlets. This follows new statistics which reveal a promising starting point for the new strategy:

- Knife crime injury has fallen 25 per cent (120 to 90) in three years
- Serious youth violence has fallen 7.7 per cent (310 to 286) in three years

You will hear from the Exploitation team on what the implementation of this strategy looks like and how this affects Tower Hamlets.
