Dear Parents and Carers,

Our value in school this week has been kindness. I was very moved, when in a class I was observing in earlier this week, a little girl noticed that a boy new to our school, was unsure of what to do. She approached him and asked if she could help. He declined initially, but she would not take no for an answer. She was concerned that he might get in to trouble and enrolled her friend to help her so that they could model together, what he needed to do.

This moment has stayed with me all week, as such a lovely example of what this value means, in action, in our school. This act of kindness was not prompted by an adult, but came entirely from the girl in question. A clear example of our values, absolutely impacting positively on the behaviour of the children and their impact upon one another.

Update on arrangements at the end of the day

I wrote to you a while back to explain that we would be employing staff to liaise with you when children are collected late at the end of the school day.

I am pleased to report back, that since we took steps to change our way of working, the numbers of children collected late has significantly reduced, so I wanted to thank you for working with us on this issue

To improve this service further, we have noticed that some parents collecting late would prefer to stay outside and have their children sent out to them.

Please be aware that we will need you to come into the building and sign to say that you have collected your son and daughter. This is necessary for safeguarding reasons. When you sign you will also be acknowledging the time of pick up which will help us to monitor what is happening more closely and to work fairly with you.

Request re the school Reception Area

We have noticed that increasingly, our Reception area is used as a waiting area, particularly between the end of the school day and the end of after school clubs.

This is not an issue at all, so long as people are quiet whilst waiting, given that staff are still working at that time, and are very often engaged in making and receiving telephone calls.

Recently I have been informed that children are riding scooters in there or playing games.

Please can I ask that if children are waiting for siblings, that they either have something quiet to get on with or if they need to run about, this happens outside?

Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.

Update on the playgrounds redevelopment

I am pleased to report that we have commissioned a company called Timotay to do the resurfacing of the football pitch. Planning will commence after the half term break and they expect to start on site, after the School Fete, but before the end of the school term.

Progress to secure a contractor for the front playground continues, but before that work can take place we need to do external building and ground works. All of the guttering on the front of the building will be done as well as brickwork and painting. We have also just received confirmation that the Diocese will support us in getting vital works done to our drains and pipework.

Once this is complete, we will then be able to lay the final surface. We hope to complete these works by October half term.

With reference to the 'Green Area' drawings are now complete and we anticipate being able to progress these works if not before, certainly over the summer break.

I hope you all enjoy a restful half term. School resumes on Monday 3rd June.

Year 3 have had a fantastic week! I think the highlight was our special visit to the farm on Wednesday afternoon. It was extremely valuable to the children to be able to see the animals we have been writing and reading about in our literacy topic. Year 4

Year 4 have worked hard to finish their box designs for an Art project linked with the V & A Museum of Childhood. The children's work will form part of an installation consisting of 350 boxes made by 19 schools! Additionally, the children have finished writing the ending to their Romulus and Remus legend in English; they learnt about how to search safely on the internet in Computing and have developed their bowling and batting skills for cricket in PE. Year 5

This week we have been writing an exciting myth for our mythical creatures. We also made our own Greek vases. It was so much fun! We created our own Greek tiles! In maths, we learnt how to convert decimals, fractions, and percentages and converting improper fractions into mixed numbers. This week was the best week ever! Have a lovely break!
