Dear Parents and Carers,

Healthy lives support in the borough

I have been asked to remind you all about the Active Together Programme that is delivered by the Bromley by Bow Centre and is funded by Sports England. The programme works with families with children 5- 11 years old and their siblings, offering 10-12 weekly sessions of physical activity and behaviour change.

In the programme participating families are provided with free physical activity taster sessions of badminton, yoga, table tennis, football and many more activities. In addition, they are offered fruit snacks each week, a family Action folder containing useful information about different aspects of the program and also as supporting information for topics covered in sessions such as:

- What is Physical activity, its benefits and how much we need to do daily to stay healthy,
- Information on nutrition, diet, food and hydration,
- Information about services available in the community as well as events and initiatives around the borough.
- Any other information that families feel might be useful to them.

Next Friday is Sports Relief. Children can come to school on Friday dressed in their favourite sports gear - donating £1 towards Sports Relief. Then we will move onto writing instructions. In maths we are looking at measuring, we will be comparing the height and length of different items, measuring using cubes and then rulers. In RE we will be starting our learning about the Easter story and in science comparing the different body parts of animals. We are looking forward to our trip to Hackney City Farm next Friday - your child will have their letter with them today. We really enjoyed reading interesting books and creating monster bookmarks. Everyone's costumes looked fantastic. Next week we will continue our work on fractions in Maths and retell the story of the Sea Monster in Literacy. In RE we will be starting our learning about Easter focusing on our big question 'How do Easter symbols help us to understand the meaning of Easter for Christians?' In Science we are planting beans in bags and watching them grow to observe what seeds need to grow into healthy plants. In Geography we are understanding that a journey can be made around the world.
